ADMISSIONS & WITHDRAWALS

- 1. Admission is granted to Pre-Nursery to children who are around two half to three years old as on 1st January.
- 2. Admission is granted to Class Nursery to children who are four years old as on 1st January
- Admission is granted to Class KG to children who are five 3. years old as on 1st January
- 4. Information regarding Admission is published on the school notice board and in the school website: https://www.isla.co.in, in the month of September or earlier
- 5. Admission from class I onwards will be based on vacancies or seat available
- The school will conduct the entrance test for the students 6. seeking admission to Infant School for Little Angels
- 7. Admission is given on the receipt of the following documents. Original to be shown and attested copies to be submitted. Applicable from Class KG onwards
 - Mark sheet of the last class attended
 - Birth certificate b)
 - Transfer certificate c)
 - Conduct certificate from the Head of the Institution last d) attended
 - e) Permanent Education Number (PEN) from the last school attended
- 8. A month's notice must be given before a child is withdrawn from the school and the full fees are to be paid (Fees of the whole year). If the T.C is taken after the school re-opens, the full fees for the whole year must be paid even if the student was not attending the school.
- 9. The school leaving Certificate will be issued when all dues have been paid in full and on receipt of a written application from the parent/guardian mentioning the Admission number, Class, Section and the Roll No. of the pupil. Fee Receipt must be produced at the time of applying for the T.C.

10. School Leaving certificate and other certificate can be collected from the school office after 3 (Three) working Days of the submission of the application, and on payment of Rs.600.00. Transfer certificates are not issued after 90 days of leaving from school.

SCHOOL FEES

- 1. The School fees cover twelve calendar months and are paid in four installments or in advance. No reduction is made for holidays or broken periods. Pupils are charged full fees as long as their names are officially on the rolls. Fees once paid are not refunded.
- 2. School fees are strictly to be paid to the principal and only by parents/Guardians so that proper records are maintained.
- 3. Pupils joining or leaving the school during any term will have to pay all the fees for the whole year, including the bus fee if he/she travels by the school bus.
- 4. No bills or reminders are issued: Therefore, parents/guardians should see that the fees are paid on time.
- Pupils whose dues are not cleared will receive their results 5. once the dues are cleared.
- 6. Any certificate or extract from the register will cost Rs.100/or more.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Wearing the school uniform is compulsory every day. We believe uniform helps to improve the school's ambience by decreasing destruction in the classroom, while increasing the children's eagerness to learn. Further, this tradition contributes to a strong sense of community as Infant School for Little Angels (ISLA). It creates a sense of togetherness among all with added benefits of having neat and well-groomed children. Special Casual or party dress are permitted on several special occasions during the year.

- 1. Every student must possess an identity card issued by the school. Failing to bring, Rs.50/- will be fined. If a student loses his/her school ID a written application to issue a new school ID must be made to the Principal/Vice-Principal
- 2. All the boys are asked to have short hair. Coming to school with coloured hair is not allowed
- 3. Girls are not allowed to come to school with coloured hair. Hair should be tied properly with ribbons as specified for the dress code
- 4. Mehendi, Kajal, bindi, nail polish, bangles, earrings, rings, and necklace are not allowed. If found will be penalized by the school authority
- Hair gel, hair colour, hair style with long hair and fashionable 5. cut are not allowed.
- 6. Every student should wear a clean and complete and correct uniform daily. A pupil who comes to school without proper uniform or whose uniform is untidy and/or ill-fitting will not be allowed to attend the classes.
- 7. Students should bring a written application from the parents/ guardians when he/she is not in full uniform, otherwise the student will not be allowed to sit in the class.

- 8. Students should trim their nails regularly
- 9. TEXT BOOKS, EXERCISE BOOKS, STATIONERY & UNIFORMS
 - The school provides the textbooks & Exercise books for the students. Students must have new textbooks and all text and exercise books must be covered.
 - 2. Stationery like pen, pencil, eraser, ruler, ribbon, colour, additional exercise book, modelling clay etc. are sold from office 2. Students can buy as per their requirements.
 - Additional uniforms if required are also available in office 3. 2. The parents/guardians are to take proper size uniform for their children

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION & COMMUNICATION

- 1. Infant School for Little Angels is an English Medium School. The students and teachers will converse in no other language except English in the school premises.
- 2. If a student is found talking other than English language in the school premise, a fine will be imposed. A fine of Rs. 100/- will be imposed on those students found speaking other than English in the school premise.

ABSENCE & LEAVE

- 1. Attendance on the first day after the Holidays is a must. Failure to do so will have its own Consequences. In case of illness application should be submitted with the medical certificate.
- 2. Prior leave must be obtained for religious ceremonies or special occasions. Such reasons as birthdays, excursions, festivals, social functions, family affairs, urgent business, studying for exams, etc. are not considered sufficient reasons for leave. A student who is absent for more than 3 days (three days) leave will have to pay a fine of Rs. 100 per day if without valid

reason.

- 3. After an absence from school, the reason for the absence must be written and duly signed by the parents in the 'Absence from School page; failing which marks will be deducted from the ensuing exams (from the Subject taken by the class teacher).
- 4. If absent for medical reasons, Medical certificate is to be furnished if a child is absent for more than three days on medical grounds.
- 5. Pupils must not absent themselves from school on the day prior to holidays or tests/exams. They must rejoin the classes after the holidays on the reopening day itself. Any breach of this rule without prior written application and permission will be considered a serious offence and is punishable.
- 6. Those who are absent on the re-opening day after vacation (except those with prior written permission) will have to take re-admission/pay fine.
- 7. A pupil who has been absent for 15 calendar days without due written authorization from the Principal will be considered as having left the school and his/her name struck off the rolls.
- 8. Any leave involving more than 3 calendar days must be applied for in person and a written permission obtained from Principal. Merely submitting an application or a telephonic message won't suffice. 85% of attendance is required to be eligible for appearing in the Exams.
- 9. Early departures can be availed when there is an emergency at home or when the student gets sick in the school.

TESTS/EXAMS/PROMOTION

1. The school will conduct two Unit Tests, Half Yearly and Final Examination. The students are to study and know the subject matter to be promoted. If the student performs less than 40% marks in the promotion examination, he/she will be detained in the same class.

- 2. The checking of copies, assignments, class tests, projects etc. will also carry some marks.
- 3. Care for the common property, cleanliness of the School campus and reverence for one another is to be the concern of everyone. (Teachers, students & parents)
- 4. Every exam will be followed by the evaluation of the answer script by the teachers, parents & Students. An open day will be reserved for this purpose
- Students who use unfair means during the examination like 5. copying or bringing answers written in sheets of paper or any other means will get zero in that subjects and will be debarred from writing further examinations.
- 6. Pupils who fail in Promotion Exams may be asked to leave the school as being either unwilling or unable to study. In no case, however, will a student be allowed to repeat the same class for a third time. A student who fails twice in two consecutive years must be withdrawn.
- 7. Due to any unforeseen circumstance, if a test/exam is not held on the scheduled date, the same will be held on the next working day, unless otherwise notified. No early exams or later exams shall be conducted for anybody whatsoever.

GENERAL RULES & DISCIPLINE

- 1. Infant School for Little Angels is a privately owned school, hence all should adhere to the guidelines set by the institution.
- 2. The school property should be utilized with utmost care as it has to serve for many generations to come. Any damage to the desks, benches, tables etc. should be reported immediately to the principal or the teacher in charge.
- 3. No act of indiscipline, interference in the administration, and disrespect to the members of the staff by students or parents shall be tolerated and the delinquent may even be expelled from the school

- 4. Irregular attendance, unjustified or unexplained absence, habitual idleness, disobedience, conduct injurious to the moral tone of the school are sufficient reasons for dismissal of a student at any time of the year. One whose misconduct is liable to be injurious to others may be dismissed.
- 5. While utmost precaution is being taken, the school cannot be held responsible for accidents, minor or serious to pupils during the stay in the school or while taking part in sports and co-curricular activities within or outside the school premises.
- Guardians and parents are requested to make proper 6. arrangement to collect the children immediately after school hours. Though proper care will be taken to ensure the safety of the children the school cannot be held responsible if the student leaves the school campus on his her own accord.
- 7. Parents/Guardians should bring the escort card in order to take your children home after the class
- 8. The school diary is a record concerning the student. Therefore, every student should take special care of the diary and bring it to class daily. If one loses it, one should get a written authorization from the Principal to buy a duplicate diary with a fine of Rs. 300.00.
- 9. Pupils are subject to school discipline not only in the school but also while coming from and returning to their home and at other public places.
- 10. Any damage done to the school property must be made good by those concerned. Iron or steel rulers are not allowed in
- 11. No magazines, comics, papers, books or printed matter other than School textbooks and the School Diary, may be brought to the school without the permission of the Principal. School bags, parcels and letters are subject to inspection. All printed materials except those mentioned in the school book list when brought into school must be presented to the principal/Vice

- principal for approval.
- 12. Students are required to treat teachers and all members of the staff, teaching and non-teaching, with respect and politeness. Arrogant and challenging behaviour towards teaching or non-teaching staff is forbidden. On their way to and from school, students must behave in a gentlemanly/ gentlewomanly manner.
- Students must show gentleness and courtesy to their 13. companions. Refinement of manners, uprightness and selfrestraint should be the distinguishing mark of our pupils.
- Duty, Discipline, Punctuality and Respect should be the 14. hallmark of every student.
- Pupils are responsible for the safe custody of their books and 15. belongings. Each article should be marked with the pupil's name.
- 16. Presents / Gifts to the staff or demonstrations in their honour are not permitted in the school. Collections for any purpose whatsoever can only be made with the permission of the principal.
- Smoking, chewing pan, chewing gum, betel-nut or tobacco 17. product, etc. is strictly forbidden. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience, bad conduct, stealing, consumption of alcohol, drug abuse, any form of verbal or written obscenity, using unfair means in examination or sickness which are liable to be injurious to other boys/girls justify dismissal.
- 18. Electronic gadgets, Cell phones, laptops, tablet, digital watches, smart watches, slam books, toys, calculators, video games, pen drives, PSPs, DVDs, CDs, portable audio and video devices and any mass storage devices are forbidden in the school. Students who bring any of the above items are liable to be penalized. It would mean confiscation of the unit, suspension for a period of one week it may even lead to the dismissal of the student.

19. Seized or confiscated articles will not be given back. In case the parents insist for the return of such confiscated articles it shall be granted to them provided they agree to withdraw the boy or the girl from the school. In such case T.C. will be issued and a complete payment of the Fees for the whole year will have to be made.

CULTURAL & CO-CURRICULAR **ACTIVITIES**

- 1. The school organizes an array of co-curricular activities for the total development of the student. All students are obliged to take part in these. Excellence in academics alone doesn't make a complete person.
- 2. Some of the other activities and competitions that are organized in the school are: Sports & Games, Fine arts. Elocution, Speech, Singing, Recitation, Fancy Dress, Quiz, Drama, Spelling Bee, Storytelling, Exhibitions, Field trips, Excursions, Hikes and Picnics etc. planning and execution of these activities are carried out in the academic calendars for each month.

SCHOOL VEHICLE/BUS

- 1. The school owns a private vehicle for transportation of students residing in remote and far flung areas so that they reach school on time.
- 2. To obtain accessibility to transportation, a form has to be officially taken from the principal and complete the formalities
- 3. The hiring charge is set by the school office and as per the distance from the school to the destination of the student
- 4. On their way to and from the school, the students are expected to behave well keeping in mind the name and honour of the school.

5. Any problem regarding the bus, please refer to the school authorities only. Parents are not allowed to board the school bus. If any parent misbehave with the driver or the helper or threatens the driver or the helper or wants favour from the driver for their ward shall not be tolerated. If such incidents occur the student will be issued T.C.

FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS

- 1. Parents retain their rights and duties in the education of the children, even though they delegate them in part to the school. The support and collaboration of the parents/guardians are in all cases are considered indispensable for the overall success of the child.
- 2. The school diary should be checked and signed every day for any instructions that may have been given and for homework as well. Please check the diary for remarks regularly.
- 3. Enrolment in the school implies, on the part of the parents and students, willingness to comply with the requirements and regulations of the school.
- 4. Parents are requested to notify the school authorities whenever there is a change in their address or telephone numbers, as recorded in the Identity Certificate in the school diary, and School ID.
- 5. Parents and guardians are not allowed to meet their wards or interview teachers during the class hours without due permission of the principal
- Parents POSITIVE COOPERATION with the school is 6. absolutely essential for the constructive upbringing of their sons/ daughters. They are strongly exhorted to co-operate with the school:
 - By urging their wards to be regular and punctual in a) attendance.
 - b) By checking the School diary on a regular basis.
 - By seeing that their wards are diligent at their homework c) and lessons.

- By insisting on neatness and cleanliness in their books, d) shoes (both black and canvas) and personal appearance.
- e) By occasionally meeting the Principal / Vice Principal and Teachers to discuss the progress of their wards.
- 7. Periodical reports, and the Report Card, will keep parents / guardians informed of the progress of their wards.
- 8. Ordinarily communication with parents / guardians is made through the School diary or WhatsApp group or through the school website.
- School campus is no smoking area on all days. Please do not 9. bring disposable bottles, plastic items, chewing gums and other unhealthy eatables in to the school campus.
- 10. Exemplary behaviour is expected from students and parents in the school campus and outside the school campus.
- Parents/Guardians threatening the school by various methods, 11. by levelling malicious or false allegations or spreading rumours or giving false information which tends to bring into disrepute the school or its employees or spreading panic among them might result in issuing of Transfer Certificate to their ward from the school.
- 12. All communication to the school should be addressed to the Principal.

ISLA LIBRARY RULES

- 1. Strict silence and order must be observed by all in the library.
- 2. Every student of the school has access to the library during the library hours.
- 3. All articles personal belongings and bags must be left outside when entering the library. Only an exercise-book and library book, may be taken into the library.
- 4. Books exclusively meant for consultation are not to be taken out of the library. They remain available to all students all the time.
- 5. Before leaving the library every student must submit for scrutiny the books borrowed.

- 6. Books borrowed from the library must be returned directly to the librarian. They must not be circulated. A student who circulates books borrowed from the library may have his/her library card withdrawn and be fined as well.
- 7. Any defect noticed in a book that is borrowed, the librarian should be notified. Failure to do this checking renders one liable to be considered responsible for the defect noticed on the return of the books. Fine will be imposed for the damages done to books and articles in the library.
- 8. Book lost must be replaced by the borrower.
- A remark will be entered in the library page of the school 9. Diary for every book returned late. Three such remarks will result in the withdrawal of the lending card and a fine of Rs. 50/- may be imposed.

- No pendrive or any external hard disk will be used in the 7. Lab.

- These evils draw God's anger upon us. But if we keep these 0 evils far away from us, God will never fail us with His blessings.

ATTITUDE TO TEACHERS

- The students should look upon their class-mates as Brothers o & Sisters and upon their Teachers as Superiors as Fathers/ Mothers.

WARNING CRITERIA

- ** Using slang words-2 mark will be deducted. (From any major subject) by class teacher
- * Fights and abuses each other in or outside the class or any violent behaviour-2 marks will be deducted (from any Major subject) by class teacher
- ** Gets caught Cheating, lying, stealing-2marks will be deducted from any major Subject.
- Indulges in any sort of indiscipline and misbehaviour 2 marks * will be deducted (from any Major subject)
- ** Violates dress code or comes to school without proper dress or incomplete uniform-1 mark will be deducted (from any major subject)
